

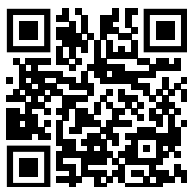

Join us for a special day of workshops and conversation to help filmmakers deepen their knowledge, expand their network, and learn from accomplished working artists.

This year, our cozy space at the Kindship Studio means that we can accommodate pre-registered filmmakers and VIP Passholders. We will have a limited number of seats available for VIP and GA Passholders as space permits.

10:00am-11:00am: CARVING A PATH FROM VISION TO SCREEN
